November Revisions Provide Clarity to California's Heat Illness Regulations

Sure it's cold outside now, but come summer, your fair's employees will appreciate the fact that their supervisors know the latest state guidelines for preventing heat-related illnesses.

In November, the Cal/OSHA Standards Board adopted Cal/OSHA-recommended heat illness regulation revisions.

In full support of the revisions, the California Chamber of Commerce views them as "...a balanced approach to protecting the health and safety of outdoor workers while recognizing the realities of outdoor workplaces for employers."

Among the revisions is a "shade up" provision that kicks in when temperatures reach 85 degrees Fahrenheit, high heat procedures that go into effect at 95 degrees, and a clarified definition of what constitutes a shade break.

In addition, employees on the job for 14 days or less must be closely supervised unless they can prove they are accustomed to working on hot days.

Note: these rules apply to all outdoor workplaces, except the high heat provisions, which apply only to select occupations.

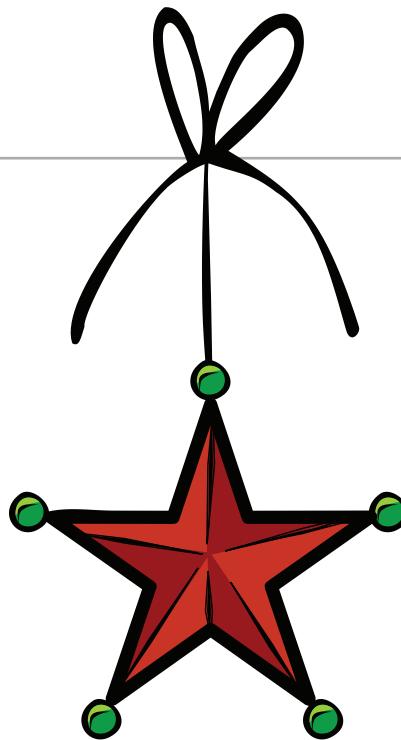
